Sidney Hook,democracy is a form of government in which important government decisions are directly or indirectly based on the agreement of a majority given freely from the adult people.

Philippe C. Schmitter and Terry,democracy is a system of government in which governments are held accountable for their actions in public areasby citizens who act indirectly through competence and cooperation with their elected representatives. Meanwhile, according to Henry B. Mayo, democracy is a system that shows that general policy is determined on the basis of a majority by representatives who are effectively supervised by the people in periodic elections based on the principle of political equality and held in an atmosphere of guaranteed political freedom.

From the four expert opinions above, that democracy contains values, namely the element of trust given by the government to the people, there is an accountability for a leader. Meanwhile, Abdurrahman Wahid revealed that democracy contains two values, namely basic values and derivations. The main values of democracy are freedom, equality, deliberation and justice. - 3. Accept suggestions or criticisms from other students during discussions in the classroom
- 4. Make decisions by deliberation on matters concerning academic activities outside of lectures.
